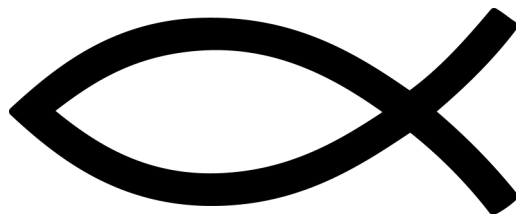
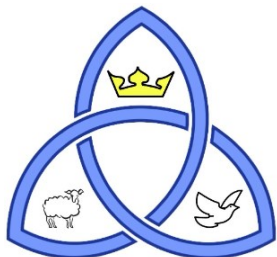

Key Vocabulary

Atheist	Someone who does not believe in any god or gods, or who believes that no god or gods exist.
Agnostic	Someone who does not know, or believes that it is impossible to know, if a god exists.
Theist	Someone who believes in the existence of god or gods. Especially a god who created the world and who acts to influence events.
Morality	A set of personal or social standards for good or bad behaviour and character or the quality of being right and honest.
The Golden Rule	World religions share a common virtue, that is universally taught, respect, revered: it is often referred to as The Golden Rule. This simple, moral principle is prevalent in world religions and cultures throughout history - Matthew 7:12. Humanists try to embrace the moral principle known as the 'Golden Rule', otherwise known as the ethic of reciprocity, which means they believe that people should aim to treat each other as they would like to be treated themselves – with tolerance, consideration and compassion.
