The subject web below shows some of the main areas of learning that will be covered in our class over the Spring term.

English

Our focus class texts this term are 'Nevermoor by Jessica Townsend and 'The Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling'. Whilst studying Nevermoor, we will write a diary entry, an advert and a report. Using The Jungle Book, we will write a personal narrative, instructions and a monologue.



Mathematics

We will be learning about decimals and how to convert them into fractions. We will learn to understand the terms tenths, hundredths and thousandths, and how to round decimals. We will link this learning to percentages and we will learn how to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages.

Science

In Science, our focus will be 'living things and their habitats'. Our studies of this unit will include vertebrates and invertebrates, classification, the anatomy of plants, mammals and metamorphosis. We will be dissecting plants to learn about their reproductive parts.

History

In History, we will study the origins of renewable and non-renewable energy sources.

Geography

Geography will be our main *topic* focus this term where we study the needs of the planet.

Our learning will focus on:

- Land use
- Trade links and distribution of natural resources
- Renewable and non-renewable energy sources
- What is recycling?
- What and how can we recycle?
- Improving the environment
- The effects of plastic pollution
- How we can all help
- What is a carbon footprint?

Our supporting texts will be Europe: the study book (CGP) and Window/Belonging (Jeannie Baker).

PSHE

We will be learning to keep ourselves safe in school and in the community.

Computing

We will study the research techniques and coding.

RE

We will be learning about Hinduism and Judaism.

French

We will be learning about dates and families.

Music

All the learning is focused around two songs: Make You Feel My Love and The Fresh Prince.

PE

This term, we will be developing our skills in Gymnastics and Dance.

PE kits are required every Monday.

Art/DT

Our topic-related Art will involve sounds maps, framing nature and charcoal drawing. We will study the artist Wassily Kandinsky and create geometric fabric prints.

In DT, we will study 'global food' and get the chance to discover the exciting and diverse choice of food available around the world.
