Year 1

In Year 1, we dedicated the whole week to the Nibbles, the Book Monster Books by Emma Yarlett.

In English, we did character studies of Nibbles, including using adjectives in expanded noun phrases, exclamation sentences, and question sentences. We culminated with a Wanted! Poster for Nibbles, utilising our learning.

In Guided Reading, we looked at the Author and predicted where Nibbles may go next. We wrote letters to the author with questions.

World Book Week 2023

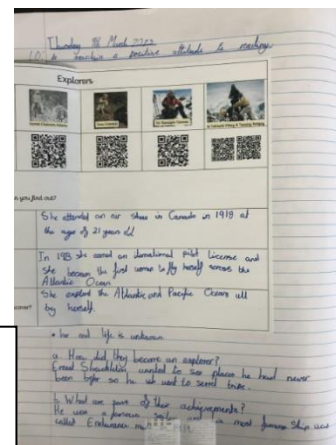
Year 3

Year 5

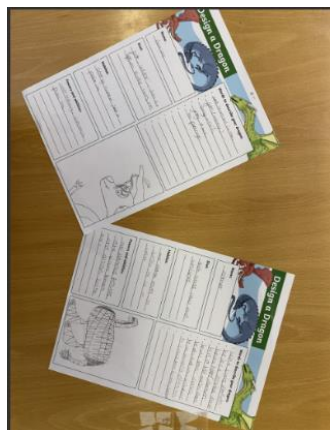
In Year 5, we researched real life explorers and did a free write to link with our class text 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell.
