Key Vocabulary

Exodus	<i>Exodos</i> means leave , and the book of Exodus tells how the nation of Israel left Egypt. It tells the history of the story of the Israelites' freedom after four hundred years of slavery and how God sent Moses as their deliverer.
The Torah	The Torah, meaning teaching, instruction or law, is the main Jewish holy book.
Judaism	A religion developed among the ancient Hebrews and characterised by belief in one God who has revealed himself to Abraham, Moses, and the Hebrew prophets. Israelite / Hebrew .
Jew	A person who whose religion in Judaism - Jewish
Shabbat	Saturday - the day of rest and weekly observance of God's completion of creation. Shalom - peace
Rosh Hashanah	The Jewish New Year.
Yom Kippur	The Jewish Day of Atonement—the most solemn day of the Jewish year. A day devoted to self-examination, and the chance to begin the New Year with a clean slate.
Sukkot	A celebration of the fall harvest, this holiday also commemorates the time when the Hebrews dwelt in the Sinai wilderness on their way to the Promised Land.
Hanukkah	A festival celebrating liberation from oppression, freedom of worship, and finding light in the darkest of times.
Passover	A festival of freedom that marks the Hebrew exodus from Egypt long ago. Pesach
